MOOCs, e-content Development & Open Educational Resources

A massive open online course (MOOC) is a free Web-based distance learning program that is designed for the participation of large numbers of geographically dispersed students.

The word MOOC was coined in 2008 by Dave Cormier, from the University of Prince Edward Island for a course offered by the University of Manitoba, "Connectivism and Connective Knowledge."

In 2011, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) Open Courseware (OCW) became the first large collections of MOOC resources made available by a university.

Learning happens most easily when students feel connected to the content, the instructor, and each other. The objective of this FDP was to create general awareness about the MOOCs among faculty so as to achieve its effective and maximum utilization.

The objective of this FDP was to create general awareness about the MOOCs among faculty so as to achieve its effective and maximum utilization.

Date wise brief Report for each day of the one-week FDP programme is given below with the feedback at the end:

Date: 7th January 2019 (First Day)

INAUGURAL SESSION

The programme was inaugurated in the morning at SBU seminar hall on 7th January 2019 by hands of Dr. D.K. Singh (Director, BIT Sindri), Dr. Ashok Kr Choudhary (Director, UGC Human Resource Development Centre), Prof. (Dr.) Vijay Kumar Singh (Registrar, SBU), Prof. (Dr.) S.K. Singh (Dean Academic, SBU) and others.

In his inaugural address, Dr. Vijay Kumar Singh stressed upon the paradigm changes from blackboard-based teaching to modern ICT base teaching and the importance of using online tools for teaching and evaluation in present days.

He shared his views with the faculty participants that if faculty wants to develop themselves and their students, then attending such faculty development programmes would enhance their skills of teaching concepts practically. He briefed the participants about the subjects chosen for the FDP and highlighted the reasons and importance of the same.

In his message, Chief Executive Officer of Sarala Birla University, Shri Pradeep Kumar Varma congratulated the Organising team for arranging the FDP for exchange of knowledge.

He emphasised on adaption of new technologies for teaching. In line with the current digital era, teachers are required to integrate technology in their daily teaching and replace their traditional methods with modern tools and facilities. MOOCs, online evaluations, audio and video lectures, real time feedback of learners is changing shapes of traditional classrooms.

He encouraged participants to avail the benefits of Swayam portal. He asked the teachers to think big to make the students think big.

FIRST SESSION

The resource person of the first session was Professor D.K. Singh, Director (BIT Sindri). He said that the whole teaching concept was widely changed with the introduction of information technology.

Dr. Choudhary started his discussion with very basic idea of concept of education, learning and teaching. He shared important aspect to be considered in teaching-learning process.

He highlighted the importance of learning and gave idea about domains of learning. He shared his knowledge with participants using power point presentation.

A number of real-life examples helped to make subject fully understand and created interest among the participants.

Date: 8th January 2019 (Second Day)

SECOND SESSION

Prof. S.P. Singh, Former Vice-Chancellor, Veer Kunwar Singh Ara University was the resource person for second session. At present, sir is Vice-Chancellor of Himalayan University, Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh. He welcomed all and spoke on role of teachers. He said teachers need to follow ethics, like love for learning and should be empathetic to all.

His topic was Environment and Sustainable Development. This session focused on the relationship between the access to energy through renewable energy base systems with the sustainability. The environment without development is life without opportunity.

He invited the young community to come forward to protect the environment to avoid a situation where there is a queue for even basic amenities like water or clean air.

THIRD SESSION

Third session of One-week Faculty Development Programme witnessed Prof. Mohd Raziuddin, Former Vice-Chancellor, Ranchi University as Resource Person. He was UGC Emeritus Fellow, Vinoba Bhave University, Hazaribag. He welcomed all and said all teachers are basically researchers.

His topic was Research paper writing and how to publish it in reputed journals. He mentioned that no matter how exceptional a piece of research material is, if it does not meet the proper requirements of a journal, it may not even be considered for publication.

He asked researchers to exchange ideas, get their name and work into circulation and develop new concepts. He suggested participants to build a strong network with other researchers and subject experts.

Date: 9th January 2019 (Third Day)

FOURTH SESSION

Dr. Saroj Ranjan, Associate Professor, University Department of Management, Sarala Birla University was the Resource Person for fourth session. His topic of interaction was Research – what is it and how it is pursued.

He said if we need to add some value to education, we must do prior research.

Research is a systematic and careful investigation undertaken to establish facts or principles. It should be self-explanatory.

He explained types of research and process of research in detail. This session was very helpful for the research scholars.

FIFTH SESSION

Fifth session of FDP was graced by Professor Vijay Bahadur Singh, Ex-Director, HRD as Resource Person. At present he is working as Professor, Department of Commerce and Management, Ranchi University. He emphasized that quality among teachers can be built only through development programs.

He gave his thanks and blessings to University management for the achievement in such a short span of time and appreciated for contribution in promoting quality education in the Jharkhand region.

Focusing on his topic "Quality of Education", he said it is a socio- economical concept. It is a learning concept for learners to acquire those qualities to meet standards.

Date: 10th January 2019 (Forth Day)

SIXTH SESSION

This One-week Faculty Development Programme of Sarala Birla University was organised in association with UGC Human Resource Development Centre. Resource Person of the sixth session was Professor Nirmal Kumar, Principal, Gaya College of Engineering.

He shared his experience on Outcome-based education and Continuous quality improvement.

He spoke on issues in higher education like accountability towards students, satisfying the needs of industry, maintaining academic standards, stakeholders and accreditation.

During his lecture, he also addressed the significance of Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) which is based on three philosophies, i.e. Anytime, Anyone and Anywhere.

SEVENTH SESSION

The Director of IIIT Ranchi, Professor Vishnu Priye was the Resource Person of seventh session. He chose a very exciting topic to deliver his lecture.

His topic was "Thrills of Research & Traps of Commercial Software". He discussed about the pitfalls and benefits of Research.

He explained about the paper structure that can be submitted to best journals like papers should have Title, Abstract, Introduction, Body, Conclusions, Acknowledgement, Citations and Appendix.

He emphasised on the references that one should use in his or her research paper. Paying a lot stress that one should put as many references as possible. This makes a research paper justifiable. For eighteen pages of research at least hundred references are mandatory. This also creates a good impression on the reader.

Date: 11th January 2019 (Fifth Day)

EIGHTH SESSION

Professor Ranjeet Kumar Singh, Pro-Vice-Chancellor of Kolhan University graced the Eighth session of FDP as Resource Person. He spoke on "Systematized effort to gain new knowledge in Research".

He discussed on characteristics, types and process of research where formulating the research problem is important than review, analysis, generalization and interpretation and finally conclusion. As a researcher it is mandatory for one to know the basics and have a core idea in order to satisfy the purpose of research and establish an acceptable conclusion.

He connected things starting from the Vedas to the modern philosophy of doing research. He described how the process of metamorphosis takes place when it comes to finding answer to a question.

The second issue which he emphasised on was the collection of data. According to him the two sources of data collection are the primary and the secondary sources and one has to choose among the two in accordance to the question which has been framed.

He emphasised on the framing of the research question and held it to be the fundamental and initial step to do research.

One should focus on the suitability of the research question and its applicability to which type of people even the geographic areas and mentality of the people. He made the session interactive and based on various examples for better understanding of the academicians.

Finally, when the house was open for questions the participants were keen to ask and with the same level of enthusiasm they were justifiably answered by professor.

NINTH SESSION

The Resource Person of ninth session of FDP was Dr. Raj Kumar Singh, Assistant Professor, University Department of Physics, Ranchi University. Topic of his interaction was based on "From Books to MOOCs".

He said present education pattern is plagued by Exam centric approach which has no room for students' innovation and creativity. Explaining the concept of MOOCs, he said MOOCs are free online courses available for anyone to enrol.

MOOCs provide an affordable and flexible way to students for learning new skills, advance their career and empower faculty to deliver quality educational experiences at scale. It aims to enable thousands of learners to participate in the same course with high quality digital content and interactive tools for learning.

Date: 12th January 2019 (Sixth Day)

TENTH SESSION

Professor Bansidhar Prasad Rukhariyar, Registrar, Vinoba Bhave University was the Resource Person of Tenth session. On 12th January 2019, Sarala Birla University also celebrated Swami Vivekananda Jayanti.

After paying homage to Swami Vivekananda, he spoke on the topic "Values and Ethics in Teaching". He spoke about guiding principles of our civilization where ethics and values are inbuilt in a society.

He mentioned the role of a teacher who needs to follow values and ethics in development of the society.

Sarala Birla University celebrated valedictory of this one-week Faculty Development Programme themed "MOOCs, e-content development and Open Resources" in the presence of distinguished guests. PEDAGOGY FOR 21ST CENTURY

SPEAKER: Prof. D. K. Singh

Professor D.K. Singh delivered his keynote lecture on the emerging topic 'Pedagogy for 21st Century'. He congratulated the SBU organisers for choosing such a dynamic topic for one-week Faculty Development Programme.

"A Teacher is the image of Brahma"

With the quote of Manu, he started his lecture by explaining that a teacher is the creator of the Universe. The teacher is the backbone of the educational system, maker of the mankind, architect of the society.

He said that the whole teaching concept is widely changed with the introduction of information technology. Today, all teachers are faced with the ongoing challenge of adoption of new technologies to make their teaching effective.

There is a paradigm shift in the approach of teaching. Earlier the teaching process was teacher centric and at present scenario, it is student centric.

How can we best prepare our students to be informed, conscientious leaders in a technologically advanced society?

"Despite our challenges, we have the biggest opportunity to be innovative - the biggest opportunity to do something different.", this quote of Renu Khator explains everything. Mentioning the journey of Renu Khator to University of Houston president position, Professor Singh encouraged the teachers to think globally.

In the 21st Century, an Educator needs to develop eight characteristics- The Adaptor, The Communicator, The Learner, The Visionary, The Leader, The Model, The Collaborator and The Risk Taker.

Education can be a great equalizer in this increasingly unequal, polarized and divided world. Discussing the benefits of online teaching, he said that purpose of web-based education is to make the best teachers, best authors, best instructional and reference materials available to more and more students without any kind of barriers.

Wishing the Sarala Birla University for organising Faculty Development Programme, he said SBU has the potential to do bigger thing, experiment and to innovate and make a change in the education system.

Teachers should be trained to effectively operate modern word processors (word), spreadsheets (excel), presentation devices (PowerPoint), and various software packages geared toward teaching aids.

ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

SPEAKER: Prof. S. P. Singh

Professor S.P. Singh spoke on Sustainable Development. He said all the biotic and abiotic resources influences the environment.

He gave example of Stockholm and said sustainable development means that development which meets the need of the present generation and cares for future generation.

The key objectives of sustainability include:

- Reviving economic growth so that it has a reduced impact on the environment by using less materials and energy;
- Meeting essential needs for jobs, food, energy, water and sanitation;
- Ensuring a sustainable level of population;
- Conserving and enhancing our natural resource base;

This session focused on the relationship between the access to energy through renewable energy base systems with the sustainability. The environment without development is life without opportunity.

There must be planned and systematic utilization of resources for tranquillity of development, i.e., reviving economic growth.

Energy is the driving force behind all economic activities. Consequently, the ever-increasing population and associated energy requirements to meet the increasing living standard has become a matter of great concern. In particular, the availability of suitable and sufficient energy sources, development of environment friendly utilization technologies and the cost of energy have been extremely important factors needing immediate attention.

The key to growing sustainability is not to produce less but to produce differently in a way which is environmentally friendly and compatible i.e. by embracing the philosophy of 'Cleaner Production'; not to consume less but to consume judiciously and efficiently within the regenerative capacity of the Earth ecosystems and with minimum waste generation.

The planet must shift to renewable sources of energy as compared to the regular thermal or hydropower plants that lead to climatic degradation. Solar energy is an effective alternative that we can harness using photovoltaic cells. It is less costly and environmentally friendly.

A shift to wind energy is also an option. Setting up windmills in areas with high-speed wind can help convert the natural resource into electricity for commercial or household usage. Another effective solution can come through the use of natural manure or bio-compost as a substitute for chemical fertilizers. This helps avert soil erosion and soil pollution.

The rest of the change can come majorly through increased awareness and consciousness. Only when the gravity of the situation and a moral responsibility towards forthcoming generations is realized can we pass on a healthy environment to them.

A FOUNDATIONAL GUIDE TO PUBLISHING RESEARCH

SPEAKER: Prof. Mohd. Raziuddin

UGC Emeritus Fellow **Professor Md. Raziuddin** spoke on how to publish a Research. He said Research is to ponder over a problem and to find solution with a scientific approach.

While discussing the importance of impact factor of journals, he warned the researchers not to fall prey to predatory journals.

No matter how exceptional a piece of research material is, if it does not meet the proper requirements of a journal, it may not even be considered for publication.



The number of predatory journals is increasing day-by-day and also getting more difficult to identify. Jeffrey Beall, a librarian at the University of Colorado in Denver, first coined the term "predatory journals". A predatory journal is a publication that actively asks researchers for manuscripts. They have no peer review system and no true editorial board and are often found to publish mediocre or even worthless papers. They also ask for huge publication charges.

He said that researcher should be wary of predatory journals when using and citing sources, as the articles in predatory journals may not have been thoroughly peer reviewed.

Dr. Raziuddin sir also mentioned that a good publishing work needs to meet the proper requirements of a journal.

Research is an indispensable part of academic profession and provides constant learning and development for the faculty members. It inculcates a quest to explore more and learn more to gain in-depth knowledge in the area of interest.

5 Steps Guide to Publishing

- ✓ Positioning the Research
- ✓ Organizing the Research & Submissions
- ✓ Formatting the Submission
- ✓ Including Essential Details The Final Check

A paper to be published should contain well-designed study, well-documented and based upon the significant findings.

Discussing about references and citations, he said to abide strictly to a journal's request for citation formats such as APA (American Psychological Association Standard), MLA (Modern Language Association) or AMS (American Mathematical Association).

When you plagiarize, you are robbing yourself of the opportunity to learn and showcase your skills.

It is important on the part of the researcher to properly check for plagiarism. "Be sure to write it in your own words," is a mantra that was given by sir.

While discussing about the citation, impact factor and plagiarism, he said that writing in own words helps to create something new, build valuable life skills, shows that you understand the material, helps you learn the subject and makes the time spent on the research paper more valuable.

Inadvertent Plagiarism: or any material you leveraged in your manuscript that wasn't your own, you should provide proper attribution to the original sources. Make sure you have properly cited all your sources.

Self-plagiarism: Sometimes writers do not know that they are committing plagiarism. Did you know that authors are required to cite their own previously published material if they are referencing it within a new paper due to copyright infringement policies?

RESEARCH- WHAT IS IT AND HOW IS IT PURSUED?


SPEAKER: Dr. Saroj Ranjan

Dr. Saroj Ranjan of University Department of Management, Vinoba Bhave University, Hazaribag was the Resource person of fourth session of Faculty Development Programme.

He welcomed all and spoke on "Research-what is it and how is it pursued."

The Resource Person was focused on the aspect of how to write a good research paper. Sir briefed everyone on how to write the introduction of the paper and the detailed structure of literature review. He further acquainted everyone on how data analysis should be conducted by choosing the right sample size and technique.

TYPES OF RESEARCH




Other points that he discussed was that whatever you write get it edited by the expert of that particular field in which you have written the paper. This is simply done to minimise the mistakes and remove the linguistic barriers.

He emphasised on the references that one should use in his or her research paper. Paying a lot stress that one should put as many references as possible. This makes a research paper justifiable. For eighteen pages of research at least hundred references are mandatory. This also creates a good impression on the reader.

Dr. Saroj Ranjan stated that the work should be so appropriate and reasonable that people wait for the articles. The references and paper should be genuine and clearly explain the topic. Further he talked about the procedure of framing the research question. It should be direct and justifiable. While collecting data one should reach to the abstract source of the data by reading books, articles, journals, etc.

Discussing Research Design, he said that a research Design is based on a framework and provides a direction to the investigation being conducted in the most efficient manner.



Lastly, he ended his session with an advice for the Researcher stating that they should choose a topic which is of their interest and not just for formality of doing research.

Dr. Vijay Bahadur Singh, Ex- Director, HRD was the Resource Person for the Session No 5. At present he is working as Professor, Department of Commerce and Management, Ranchi University.

The fifth technical session was started with formal welcome of Dr. Vijay Bahadur Singh. He started his discussion on "Quality Education". He further added that if faculty wants to develop themselves and their students, then attending such faculty development programs would enhance their skills of teaching the practical concepts.



The session was extremely interesting and beneficial to the faculty members where the role of a teacher in modern times was highlighted.

The facts like centre of learning, understanding the difference between teaching and learning, the teachers being constant learners, involvement of teachers, Innovation in class room and providing a controlled lenience were dealt with.

Practical learning is as much important as the theoretical learning is. This is the sole responsibility of the teachers, who transmit their theoretical and practical knowledge to their academic circles and students. So, it is essential to develop an academician who is capable of early identifying the thrust areas of research.



He gave example of Korean Education system and said it is one of the best education systems followed by other countries too. South Korea performance in education in the last four years has been masterful in execution. Their results in standardized testing and their student's ability to advance towards college graduation is the model over 200 nations, are chasing to be the best in education.

He focused on Chalk and Talk system of the Education system which is still being practised in the country. He also mentioned the pillars of "Quality of Education".

The lecture was very beneficial and provided an insight on the various challenges associated which a teacher educator has to overcome.

OUTCOME BASED EDUCATION

SPEAKER: Prof. Nirmal Kumar

The sixth session of the one-week FDP was graced by Dr. Nirmal Kumar, Principal, Gaya College of Engineering. He shared his views on Outcome-based Education and Continuous Quality Improvement.

"Man is made by his belief.
As he believes, so he is."

- Bhagavad Gita

With this quote from Gita, he said Outcome based education is a system to develop all the students embedded with all the technologies and right attitude. Sir mentioned that OBE is not just for academics but much beyond that, since it has societal need as an integral part of it.

He gave direction and guidance to participants (faculties) on how we can inculcate OBE in our academics to make students more conceptual in thinking and understanding rather just stick to curriculum for scores.

Professor Nirmal Kumar sir explained that for higher education courses, one should aim for imparting 'higher order thinking skills' as desired outcomes. These are based on Bloom's taxonomy.

He talked about three components of Outcome based Education:

- a. Acquiring knowledge
- b. Acquiring skills
- c. To develop right kind of attitude

He spoke on issues in higher education like accountability towards students, satisfying needs of the industry, maintaining academic standards, stakeholders and accreditation.

Though the use of Outcomes-based Education in higher education is comparatively recent in the Indian subcontinent, its significance in higher education learning and teaching has increased in response to the pressing requirement of educational institutions to seek accreditation from national bodies like the National Board of Accreditation (NBA), the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), and even International bodies also.

PARAMETERS OF OUTCOME BASED EDUCATION MODEL:

- Program Educational Objectives
- Program Outcomes
- Course Outcomes

He also elaborated the OBE Philosophy, Challenges and Opportunities of OBE for Technical Institutions. Sir threw light on innovations in classroom teaching and laboratory work required for OBE, also justifying the strong Industry-Institute interaction for the wholistic development of students.

He also spoke on the significance of Massive Open Online Courses which is based on three philosophies: Anytime, Anyone and Anywhere.

Both during and after the FDP, questions came from different individuals of the audience. In general, the audience appreciated the lecture and became knowledgeable about the OBE.


The seventh technical session was started with formal welcome of Dr. Vishnu Priye. He started his discussion on "Thrills of Research and Traps of Commercial Software".

He mentioned the focus required on formulating a problem to raise new questions, new possibilities, to regard old problems from a new angle and to explore un-accessible areas or to adapt to the data available.

STRUCTURE OF A RESEARCH PAPER

He discussed about the paper structure that can be submitted to the best journals. Paper structure includes title, abstract, introduction, body, conclusions, acknowledgements, citation and appendices.

In the initial submission of your manuscript, explain and support with references anything you suspect will draw the attention of a reviewer. You want to help a reviewer understand why you did what you did. And you want to anticipate and address an issue before it creates a question.



He gave an idea about research process, various methods of sampling and sampling technique, detail description about the probabilistic and non-probabilistic sampling, measurement scales and how to make use of secondary data, from where to get the secondary data and how to identify the authenticity of secondary data.

Sir mentioned the pitfalls as well as benefits of research where Interpretation and Verification is very important.

He encouraged the researcher and said "Somewhere, something incredible is waiting to be known" So search, search and search till the end.




RESEARCH - SYSTEMATIZED EFFORT TO GAIN NEW KNOWLEDGE

Sarala Birla University was privileged to have so many distinguished guests during this one-week programme. On the fifth day and in session no 8, Professor Ranjeet Kumar Singh, Pro-Chancellor, Kolhan University was the Resource Person. He was welcomed by faculty members.

After the formal welcome, he started his lecture on Systematized Effort to Gain New Knowledge in Research. It should be as per the need of the society.



He said that, field of research is dynamic and inter disciplinary which gave a knowledgeable experience. He described the objective-wise analysis of research problem.

The path of finding answers to your research questions constitutes "Research Methodology."

The difference between Research Methods and Research Methodology was discussed in detail.

He emphasised on the framing of the research question and held it to be the fundamental and initial step to do research. One should focus on the suitability of the research question and its applicability to which type of people even the geographic areas and mentality of the people. He made the session interactive and based on various examples for better understanding of the academicians.

Next topic in his session was how to approach the literature. He explicitly stated that while surveying the literature a researcher must start with the data available for the last five years and check the dominant theories in that area of research. The top ten journals cited papers leading associations and important conferences act as a lot of input to the researcher's literature.

The various types of research hypothesis were discussed the Directional, the Non-Directional and Null Hypothesis were elaborated.

At the end, when the house was open for questions the academicians were keen to ask and with the same level of enthusiasm they were justifiably answered by professor.

FROM BOOKS TO MOOCS

SPEAKER: Dr. Raj Kumar Singh

Dr. Raj Kumar Singh was the Resource Person of the Session No 9 of FDP, themed MOOCs, e-content Development and Open Educational Resources. He is associated with University Department of Physics, Ranchi University, in the capacity of Assistant Professor.

After formal welcome, he delivered his lecture on "From Books to MOOCs." He said present education pattern is plagued by exam centric approach which has no room for students' motivation and creativity.



He focused on "Blended Learning" approach. Blended learning has many names — hybrid learning, flipped classroom, mixed-mode courses, integrative learning. While there is no standard definition of blended learning, the main idea behind it is to optimise the learning experience by integrating elements of online learning with traditional face-to-face class activities or lectures.

MOOCs:

- Massive, involving hundreds and thousands of students.
- Open, in terms of access.
- Online, exclusively. All of the learning activity- content and interactions occurs online.
- Courses. MOOCs have a set start and stop time. MOOC archives are made available even after the completion of course.
- The basic philosophy of MOOCs is 3A's i.e., Anytime, Anyone, Anywhere.

He discussed the benefits of Govt of India project 'Swayam' where, with a view to providing access to the best quality learning resources across the country, the project 'Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds' (SWAYAM) has been started.

SWAYAM provides an integrated platform and portal for online courses, using information and communication technology (ICT) and covering High School till all higher education subjects and skill sector courses to ensure that every student benefits from learning material through ICT.

MOOCs Formats

xMOOCs: offered in a traditional university model such as Stanford (Coursera), MIT (Massachusetts Institute of Technology)/Harvard (edX), and Udacity.

cMOOCs: are based on a connectivist pedagogical model. cMOOCs are largely open in terms of the activities that learners can pursue related to the theme.


quasi-MOOCs: provide Web-based tutorials as OER, such as those of the Khan Academy and MIT's OpenCourseWare (OCW). These are technically not courses. They consist of OER intended to support learning-specific tasks

He discussed about Open Educational Resources (OER) materials offered freely and openly to use and adopt for teaching, learning and research.

While there are various Learning Management Software available in the market, he specifically mentioned the functionality of MOODLE, the open source software which is the market leader in the segment.

Moodle is the world's most popular and most used learning management system. It's easy to see why. The Moodle Learning Management System (LMS) is a flexible, open source and free to download learning management solution.

With 100 million users (and growing) and over 100,000 Moodle sites deployed worldwide, this user-friendly eLearning platform serves the learning and training needs of all types of organizations in more than 225 countries worldwide.



Both during and after the FDP, questions came from the participants of the FDP. In general, the audience were very enthusiastic about the lecture and became knowledgeable about the MOOCs.

At the end of the FDP, a Q & A session was addressed by Dr. Raj Kumar, where he tried to answer the queries mostly related to online creation and blended learning.


"The first step in the evolution of ethics is a sense of solidarity with other human beings."

He spoke about guiding principles of our civilization where ethics and values are inbuilt in any kind of institution or society.

He discussed the role of a teacher who needs to follow values and ethics in development of the society.

The state of society is a direct consequence on the state of education. Education is at the core of developing the people, who are the society. If the education is right, the resulting society will be harmonious and fearless; otherwise it is just a crowd or even a battlefield.



A change is needed in the education system. Education should prepare students with a larger view of life. Education should sensitize the students and equip them with an understanding of self & society. It can be carried out in 2 steps. In the first step, Human Values courses can be introduced in existing education. In the second step, entire education can be remoulded.

He said that teachers can govern the society with their values and ethics.
