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1. Genesis and Evolution of Sarala Birla University, Ranchi

Sarala Birla University is a self-financed private unitary university. The Sarala Birla University Act. 2017 (Jharkhand Act. 13, 2017) has been passed by the Legislative Assembly of Jharkhand in 2017. The Sarala Birla University Act 2017 has been published in the Jharkhand Gazette on 4th July vide the Law Department Notification No. 504 dated 4th July 2017. As per the Act 2017 the Management of the university is carried out by a Board of Governors headed by Smt. Jayashree Mohta, Honorable Chairperson, Bharat Arogya & Gyan Mandir and the first Chancellor of Sarala Birla University.

The SBU, Ranchi campus is situated amidst the verdant surroundings, stretching over nearly 60 acres of land owned by Bharat Arogya & Gyan Mandir at Birla Campus, Village - Ara, P.O. – Mahilong, Ranchi-Purulia Highway, Ranchi, and Jharkhand, India.

SBU, Ranchi has been established to create new benchmarks for quality education in various fields viz. Technical, Professional, General & Medicine Education in Jharkhand in particular & India and overseas in general.

SBU shall endeavor to promote the study of national integrity, social justice, secularism and democratic way of life, international understanding & scientific approach to the problems of the society.



Sarala Birla University has 11 Faculty Schools - Engineering & Computer Sciences, Commerce and Business Management, Pharmacy, Humanities and Linguistics, Nursing, Public Health & Clinical Technology, Legal Studies, Applied Sciences, Journalism & Mass Communication, Art, Culture & Sports, Yogic Sciences & Naturopathy, Social Sciences. All these Schools offer UG, PG and PhD Programs leading to degrees.

The University had a humble beginning with an admission of 77 students during 2018-19. At present, the total enrolment stands at around 2100 students 2022-2023.

At the Institution level, there is a dedicated team of highly qualified Faculty members and a Department of Student Affairs catering to the academic and holistic developmental needs of students.

In the year 2022-23 the institutional placement record was 80.59 % in the Faculty of Engineering and Computer Sciences, 97.18 % in the Faculty of Commerce and Business Management of Management, The highest compensation that was offered was 9.17 LPA, and several companies have offered a range of compensation between 4-6 LPA.

Highlights of Sarala Birla University:

- A strong Placement and Training Department with a committed team, the placement being more than 90% of the eligible students.
- All the Schools / departments have competent faculty with more than 55% with a PhD degree and 115 research scholars are pursuing their doctoral degree programme.



- The International Affairs Office of the University has more than 10 MOUssigned with International Universities.
- The University also has an Incubator set up in the campus, for encouraging entrepreneurship amongst faculty and students.
