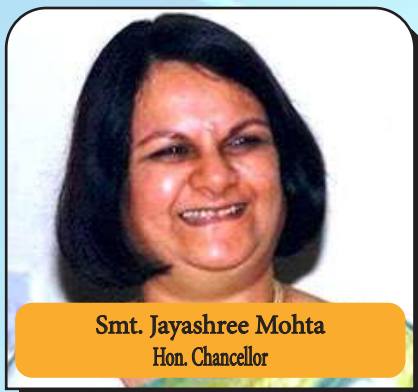

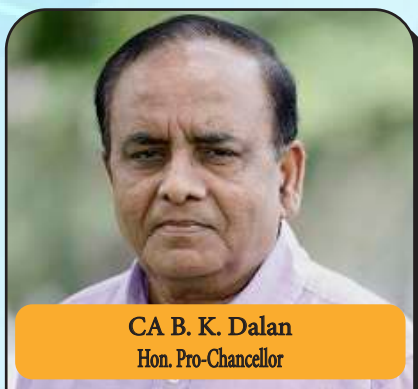

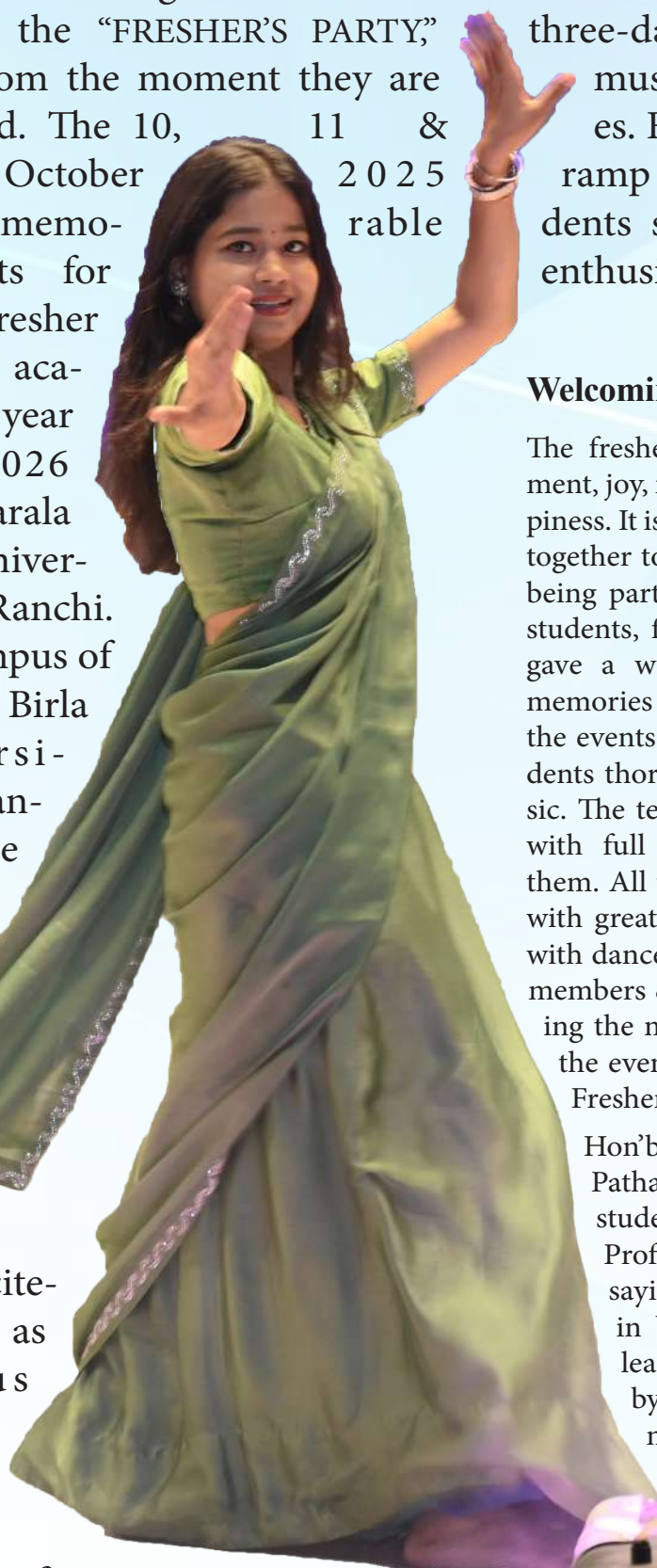

Basant Kumar Birla Memorial Lecture Series



Prepared to take greater leaps in space exploration: Dr Radhakant Padhi

Highlighting India's remarkable progress in the space sector, Dr Radhakant Padhi stated that India's achievements in space technology are world-class and that computer-based guidance technology has proven to be revolutionary and highly instrumental in this advancement.

“India is preparing to take even greater leaps in the field of space exploration in the coming years, and we are all determined to make it happen.” Said eminent scientist and Professor of Aerospace Engineering at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru Dr. Radhakant Padhi in “Basant Kumar Birla Memorial Lecture Series” organized by Sarala Birla University, Ranchi. Dr Padhi shared his insights while addressing the audience in the lecture series with the theme “Necessity and Impact of Computational Guidance on Complex Space Missions.”

Dr. Padhi elaborated on India's major space missions such as Chandrayaan-3, Aditya-L1, Gaganyaan, NISAR, XPoSat, and SPADEX. He also

discussed upcoming projects including Chandrayaan-4, Chandrayaan-5, future Mars and Venus missions, the Artemis program, and SPADEX-2.

Highlighting India's remarkable progress in the space sector, he stated that India's achievements are world-class and that computer-based guidance technology has proven to be revolutionary and highly instrumental in this advancement.

On the occasion, Prof. (Dr.) Gopal Pathak, Hon'ble Director General of the University fondly remembered Late Shri Basant Kumar Birla, describing him not only as a renowned industrialist but also as a philanthropist and distinguished educationist. He also mentioned the book “One

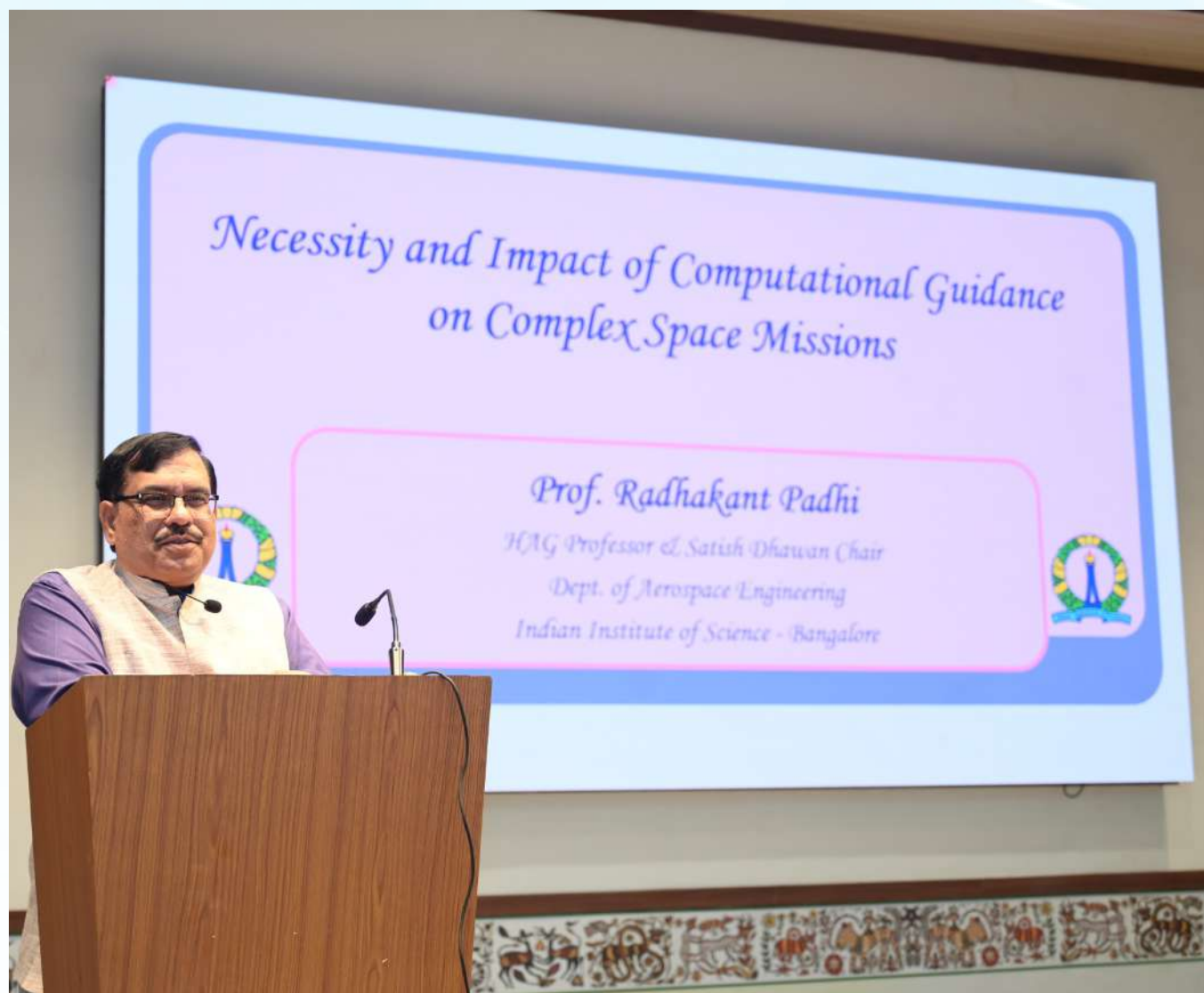
Day at a Time,” which is inspired by Birla’s life and philosophy, urging students to imbibe his values.

The program was coordinated by Dr. Meeta Verma, and was graced by Prof. (Dr.) C. Jagannathan, Hon’ble Vice-Chancellor; Prof. S. B. Dandin, Registrar, senior university officials, faculty members from various departments and a large number of students of the university.

Brief Profile

Prof. Dr. Radhakant Padhi is a well-known scientist. At present he is serving as a full-time professor in the Department of Aerospace Engineering at the Indian Institute of Science, Bengaluru. He also worked as a scientist at the Defence Research

and Development Organisation (DRDO) during 1996–1997. He has carried out significant research on synthesis algorithms in optimal control, nonlinear control, intelligent control, and state estimation. More than 240 of his research papers have been published in international journals and conferences. Prof. Padhi is an Associate Fellow of the Indian National Academy of Engineering (INAE), the Institution of Electronics and Telecommunication Engineers (IETE), the Institution of Engineers (India) (IE), and the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA).





Cooperatives - A Strong Means of Economic and Social Development: Satish Marathe

On 6 October 2025, a seminar entitled Cooperatives: A Strong Means of Economic and Social Development was held at Sarla Birla University, Ranchi. The event was organised jointly by Sahakar Bharati, Jharkhand and the university, to celebrate the “International Year of Cooperatives”.

The session began with an address by the chief guest, Satish Marathe — a founding member of Sahakar Bharati and Director of Central Board of Reserve Bank of India (RBI). Mr. Marathe offered an in-depth exploration of the cooperative movement: its different dimensions, its operational modalities, and its contribution to India’s development trajectory. He reported that out of about eight lakh cooperative groups, roughly one lakh fifty thousand are actively participating in direct economic activities. He underlined how the cooperative sector is playing a central role in building a developed and self-reliant India, noting that

nearly thirty crore Indians are associated with co-operatives, thereby underscoring the sector’s significant contribution to GDP. Furthermore, Mr. Marathe praised India’s impressive development leap over the past decade to sound economic policies. Emphasising equitable and sustainable development, he also praised the government’s mission-mode initiatives in manufacturing, innovation, research, start-ups and digitalisation. Looking further ahead, he predicted that through the wide outreach of cooperatives and enhanced credit flow in the coming years, the cooperative sector will substantially accelerate India’s GDP growth.

Next, the seminar proceedings moved forward under the stewardship of Vinay Khatavkar, Regional Organisational Minister of Sahakar Bharati, who introduced the topic and drew attention to the aims of the organisation. He stressed the need to inform the current generation appropri-

ately about the importance of cooperation. The session was chaired by Mr. Sudhir Kumar (HOD Dept. of Journalism and Mass Media, SBU). Also a lively question&answer session allowed attendees to engage directly with the speakers.

The gathering brought together a host of dignitaries and stakeholders. Among them were Dr Amarendra Pathak (State President, Cooperative Committee), Dhananjay Singh (State General Secretary), Ritesh Jha (Prant Minister), Deepma-la Ghosh (Chief General Manager, NABARD), Dr Abhijeet Kar (Director, ICAR) — under the leadership of the officials of University: Prof Gopal Pathak (Director General), Prof. C. Jagannathan (Vice-Chancellor), Prof S. B Dandin (Registrar), , organising committee members Prof Sandeep Kumar and Karan Pratap Singh, and numerous faculty members, administrative staff and students.

Expressions of appreciation were also received from Prof Bijay Kumar Dalan (Pro Vice-Chancellor, SBU) and Dr Pradeep Kumar Verma (Member of the Rajya Sabha), both appreciated the successful organisation of the seminar.

At the closing of the session, the seminar brought into sharp focus the growing relevance of the co-operative sector in India's socio-economic development. It served as a platform to heighten awareness among the university community about how cooperatives can empower large segments of society, engage them productively in economic activity, and thereby contribute meaningfully to national GDP growth. Under the leadership of Satish Marathe and the supportive partnership of Sahakar Bharati and Sarla Birla University, the path ahead for cooperative-driven development in Jharkhand and beyond seems promising.

The event’s distinguished resource person was Mrs. Tanushree Sengupta, a renowned counsellor from Army Public School, Ranchi. Mrs. Sengupta motivated students to improve their understanding and management of emotions, sharing practical advice on a spectrum of essential life skills. pression often becomes the last impression. He advised students to remain calm, know their CV thoroughly, and ensure that it truly reflects their personality and abilities.

He also highlighted the importance of personal presentation—dressing formally yet simply, maintaining positive body language, eye contact, a pleasant smile, and a confident handshake.

The session motivated students to prepare sincerely and project themselves authentically during interviews. The interactive and insightful session helped bridge the gap between campus learning and corporate expectations.

Drone & Robotics Research Lab: Shaping the Future of Automation

The Drone & Robotics Research Lab was established at Sarala Birla University (SBU), Ranchi, on 15th April 2025, under the Faculty of Engineering and Computer Sciences. The lab was established under the expert guidance of Mr. Milind Raj, popularly known as the Drone Man of India. The inauguration ceremony was graced by Hon'ble Member of Parliament (Rajya Sabha), Dr. Pradip Kumar Varma, and the event was graced by several eminent dignitaries, including Dr. Ajit Ranade, Principal Advisor to the Hon'ble Chancellor Mrs. Jayashree Mohta, Hon'ble Director General Prof. Gopal Pathak, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. C. Jeganathan,

Registrar Prof. S. B. Dandin, Dean, Engineering and Applied Sciences Dr. Pankaj K. Goswami, along with faculty and staff members.

The establishment of this lab marks a major milestone in SBU's continuous efforts to strengthen its research ecosystem and promote experiential learning among students and scholars. The lab is designed to function as a center of excellence in Drone & Robotics, where students not only learn theoretical principles but also translate their knowledge into practice through prototype development, experiments, and project-based learning.

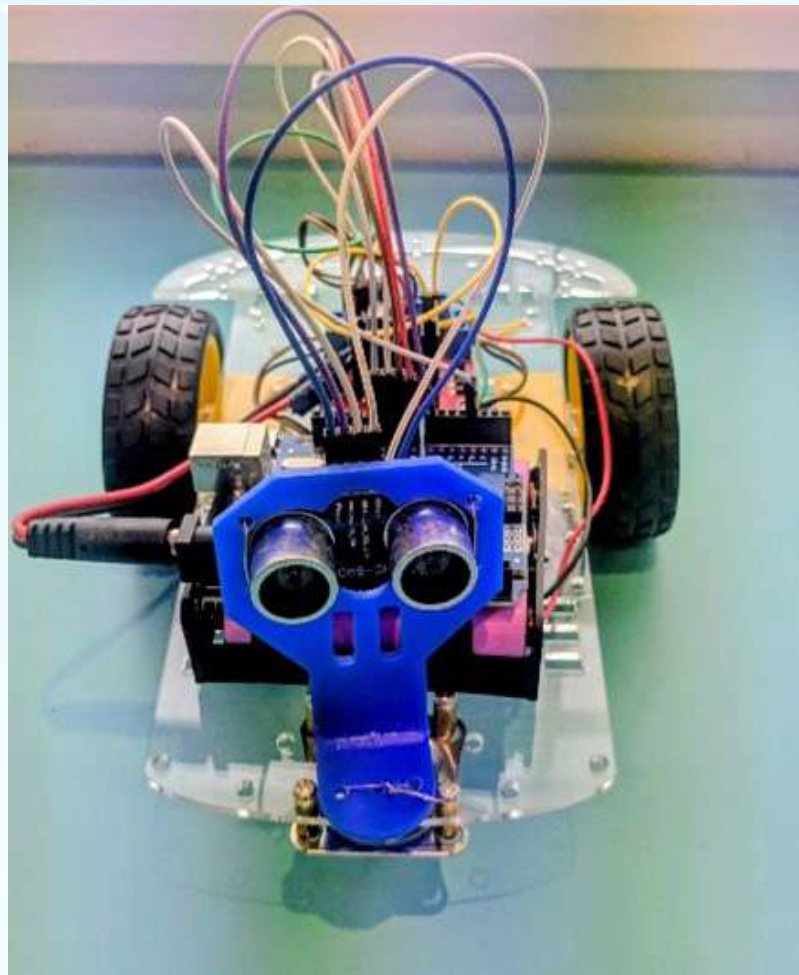


Facilities and Infrastructure in the lab

The Drone & Robotics Research Lab at Sarala Birla University is well-equipped with modern tools and resources to foster learning, experimentation, and prototype development in emerging technologies. The lab offers a practical and engaging environment for students to explore and implement concepts related to the Internet of Things (IoT) and drone technologies. It features ready-to-fly training drones and assembly kits, along with IoT development boards such as Arduino, Raspberry Pi, NodeMCU and 3D Printer. A wide range of sensors and modules-including those for temperature, motion, GPS, and obstacle detection support diverse project applications. The lab also houses embedded system tools for coding, testing, and circuit design, as well as simulation software for flight control and automation experiments. Additionally, it provides high-speed internet connectivity and Wi-Fi to enable cloud-based IoT projects, complemented by a dedicated workspace and safety setup for drone assembly and testing activities.

AI Robotics Club

An AI Robotics club is formed which is dedicated to fostering innovation, creativity, and technical excellence in the fields of artificial intelligence, robotics, and automation. The club serves as a dynamic platform where students from diverse engineering disciplines collaborate to design, build, and program intelligent robotic systems. Through hands-on workshops, hackathons, and project-based learning, members gain practical exposure to technologies such as machine learning, computer vision, embedded systems, and IoT integration. The club also encourages participation in national and international competitions, promoting teamwork and research-oriented learning. With a vision to bridge the gap between theory and real-world applications, the AI Robotics Club aims to nurture future innovators and contribute to the advancement of smart and autonomous systems.



Major Activities

- Hands-on IoT workshop based on Arduino.
- IoT-based monitoring systems using wireless sensors and cloud platforms.

- Collaborative mini-projects under faculty mentorship.

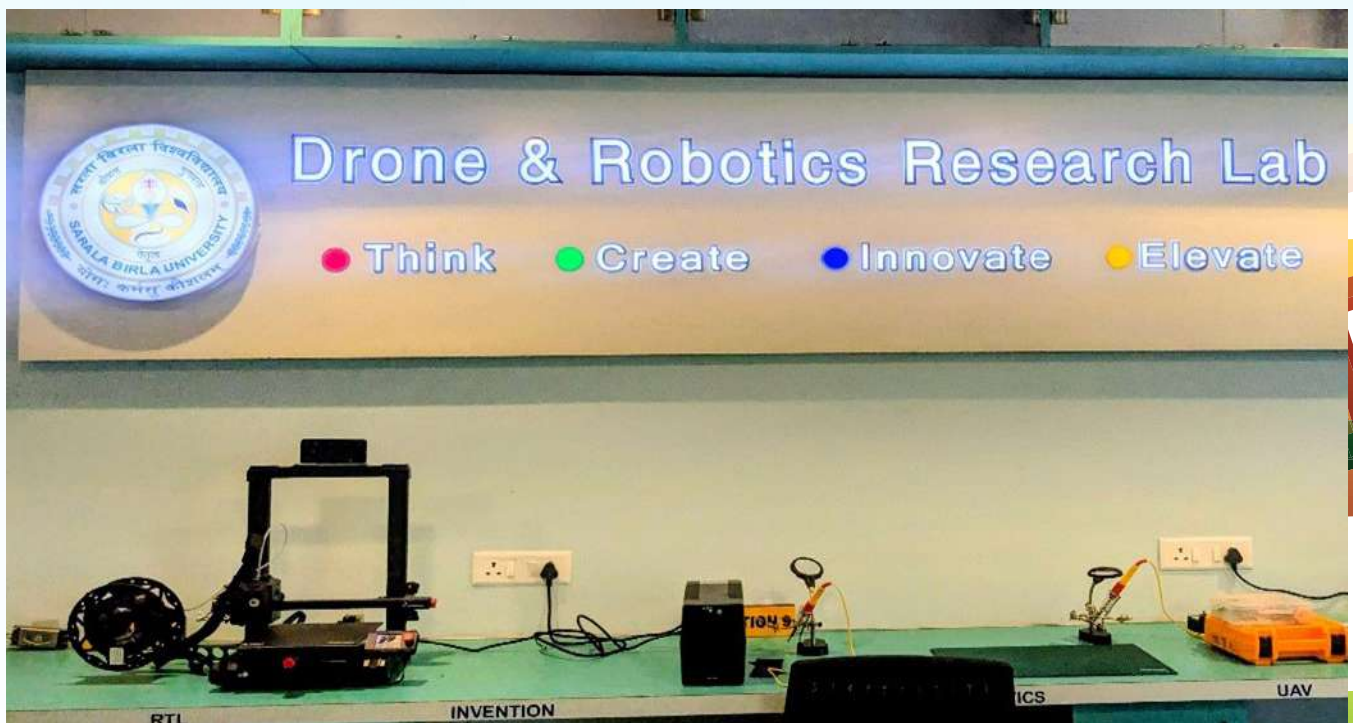
Future Plan

Awareness Workshop on YUVAi – Global Youth Challenge 2025–26

The Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering at Sarala Birla University, Ranchi, organized a one-day Awareness Workshop on YUVAi – Global Youth Challenge 2025–26” on 30th October 2025. Exploring Geoscientific Insights at GSI Training Centre, Kuju

Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering of Sarala Birla University, Ranchi conducted an Industrial visit to field training centre Kuju (GSI, Ranchi) on 13 October 2025. A Team of 5 Faculties and 89 students were taken to FTC Kuju where they were welcomed by Dr Ravi Shankar Chaubey, Senior Geologist and Faculty and Mr. Manoj Kumar Sahoo, Geologist and Faculty.

The visit was coordinated by faculty of Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering of the University, headed by Dr Meeta Verma (HoD), Mrs. Moutoshi Saha, Dr Utsav Vishal, Dr Mrinal Kumar Singh and Mr Prince Singh.

The team was then taken to a Geological site recognised by Govt. of India, Dudhinaala, where they explored various rock formations and rock history of granite which were present at site. The site shows the evidence of ancient glaciation, including glacial-marine imprints. Dr. Ravi Shankar Chaubey explained to the students how the rock types can be identified and gave insights about the mineral composition of rocks. Mr. Manoj Kumar Sahoo gave information about the formation of circular depressions by the abrasive action of fast-moving glaciers. The students also got the idea about the various training courses that are conducted in FTC. The industrial tour was very much beneficial for students

in academic enhancement, practical exposure, understanding of geological processes, problem solving ability as well as career awareness.

Activity-Based Approach Sparks Student Interest in Compass Surveying

An activity-based learning session was conducted for Diploma Semester III students by Dr. Utsav Vishal, Assistant Professor, Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering on the topic “Compass Surveying” under the course *Basic Surveying* on 14th October 2025. The session aimed to enhance conceptual clarity and practical understanding through hands-on problem-solving exercises. Students actively participated in solving real-life field scenarios. The positive response from students highlighted the effectiveness of experiential learning in bridging the gap between theory and practical application.



Unlocking the Power of Data Visualization

The Faculty of Commerce, Sarala Birla University, held a One-Day Workshop on Power BI titled “Unlocking the Power of Data Visualization” to promote skill development in data analytics. वंदे मातरम: स्वतंत्रता का अमर गान, युवाओं के लिए प्रेरणा का स्रोत

स्वतंत्रता संग्राम के दौर में जब भारत की धरती पर क्रांति की लहरें उठ रही थीं, तब एक कविता ने करोड़ों हृदयों को झंकृत कर दिया। वंदे मातरम—यह केवल शब्द नहीं, बल्कि मातृभूमि की पुकार थी, जो 19वीं सदी के अंत में बंकिम चंद्र चट्टोपाध्याय की कलम से निकली। सरला बिड़ला विश्वविद्यालय के छात्रों और शिक्षकों के लिए यह गीत न केवल इतिहास का हिस्सा है, बल्कि आज की युवा पीढ़ी के लिए राष्ट्रप्रेम और संघर्ष की प्रेरणा का प्रतीक भी। 1870 के दशक में चिनसुरा (पश्चिम बंगाल) में रचित यह कविता 1882 में उपन्यास *आनंदमठ* के रूप में प्रकाशित हुई। बंकिम चंद्र, जो कलकत्ता विश्वविद्यालय के प्रारंभिक स्नातक और ब्रिटिश सिविल सेवा के अधिकारी थे, 1857 के प्रथम स्वतंत्रता संग्राम और संन्यासी विद्रोह से प्रेरित होकर इसे लिखा। संस्कृतनिष्ठ बंगाली में रचित यह गीत प्रारंभ में बंगाल को मातृ रूप में चित्रित करता है, जिसे श्री अरविंद ने "बंगाल का राष्ट्रीय गीत" कहा। मूल संगीत जदुनाथ भट्टाचार्य ने रचा, और आज यह राग देश में गूंजता है। विश्वविद्यालय के सांस्कृतिक कार्यक्रमों में जब हम इसे गाते हैं, तो लगता है जैसे इतिहास जीवंत हो उठा हो।

कविता के छंद बंगाली लिपि में हैं, लेकिन देवनागरी, आईएएसटी और विभिन्न भाषाओं में अनुवाद उपलब्ध हैं। प्रथम दो छंद—"वन्दे मातरम्। सुजलाम् सुफलाम् मलयजशीतलाम् शस्यश्यामलाम् मातरम्"—भारत के राष्ट्रीय गीत हैं। पूर्ण कविता में मातृभूमि की सुंदरता, सात करोड़ स्वरो और देवियों दुर्गा, कमला (लक्ष्मी) तथा वाणी (सरस्वती) का उल्लेख है। श्री अरविंद का अंग्रेजी अनुवाद—"Mother, I bow to thee! Rich with thy hurrying streams..."—इसकी भावुकता को उजागर करता है। उर्दू अनुवाद अरिफ मोहम्मद खान ने किया, जबकि तमिल, तेलुगु, कन्नड़, ओडिया, मलयालम, असमिया, हिंदी, मराठी, गुजराती, पंजाबी और उर्दू में अनुवाद उपलब्ध हैं। हमारे विश्वविद्यालय की साहित्यिक सोसाइटी में जब छात्र इन अनुवादों पर चर्चा करते हैं, तो समझ आता है कि वंदे मातरम कैसे सीमाओं से परे एकता का प्रतीक है। यह गीत न केवल भाषाई विविधता को दर्शाता है, बल्कि राष्ट्र की आत्मा को जगाता है।

स्वतंत्रता संग्राम में वंदे मातरम का योगदान अतुलनीय है। 1896 में कलकत्ता कांग्रेस अधिवेशन में रवींद्रनाथ टैगोर ने इसे पहली बार गाया, जो बंगाल विभाजन (1905) के खिलाफ आंदोलन का प्रतीक बना। बनारस अधिवेशन में सारला देवी चौधरानी ने गाया, जबकि लाला लाजपत राय ने लाहौर में *वंदे मातरम* पत्रिका शुरू की। ब्रिटिश सरकार ने गीत और *आनंदमठ* पर प्रतिबंध लगाया, लेकिन

भारतीयों ने सार्वजनिक रूप से गाकर अवज्ञा दिखाई। 1901 में दक्षिण चारण सेन ने कलकत्ता अधिवेशन में गाया। 1905 में हीरालाल सेन की फिल्म का अंत गीत से हुआ। 1942 में मातंगिनी हजरा की अंतिम वाणी "वंदे मातरम" थी। महात्मा गांधी ने 1946 में गुवाहाटी में कहा, "जय हिंद वंदे मातरम को प्रतिस्थापित नहीं कर सकता।" 1907 में भीकाजी कामा के भारतीय ध्वज पर गीत अंकित था। विश्वविद्यालय के इतिहास विभाग के छात्रों के लिए यह गीत स्वतंत्रता की भावना को जीवंत करता है—एक ऐसा संदेश जो आज भी हमें एकजुट होने की प्रेरणा देता है।

वंदे मातरम विवादों का केंद्र भी रहा, खासकर मुसलमानों और कांग्रेस के साथ। बाद के छंदों में दुर्गा और लक्ष्मी का उल्लेख धार्मिक लगता है, जबकि प्रथम दो छंद मातृभूमि की स्तुति हैं। अखिल भारतीय मुस्लिम लीग और मोहम्मद अली जिन्ना ने विरोध किया। 1937 में कांग्रेस ने प्रथम दो छंद अपनाए, गांधी और नेहरू के नेतृत्व में, गैर-हिंदू भावनाओं का सम्मान करते हुए। रवींद्रनाथ टैगोर ने कहा, "प्रथम छंदों में मातृभूमि की सुंदरता है, लेकिन बाद के हिंदू तत्व हैं।" 1950 में गणतंत्र सभा ने इसे राष्ट्रीय गीत घोषित किया, राष्ट्रपति राजेंद्र प्रसाद ने कहा, "वंदे मातरम... जना गण मन के समान सम्मानित होगा।" 2017 में मद्रास उच्च न्यायालय ने तमिलनाडु स्कूलों में साप्ताहिक तथा सरकारी कार्यालयों में मासिक गान अनिवार्य किया। विश्वविद्यालय के बहस क्लब में जब हम इन विवादों पर चर्चा करते हैं, तो समझ आता है कि गीत कैसे समावेशी राष्ट्रवाद का प्रतीक बन सकता है।

वंदे मातरम की कानूनी स्थिति और सांस्कृतिक प्रभाव आज भी जीवंत है। 24 जनवरी 1950 को संविधान सभा ने इसे राष्ट्रीय गीत अपनाया, लेकिन संविधान में "राष्ट्रीय गीत" का उल्लेख नहीं। कोई गान नियम नहीं, लेकिन 2022 में दिल्ली उच्च न्यायालय को सरकार ने कहा कि जना गण मन और वंदे मातरम समान स्तर पर हैं। 1937 का ब्रिटिश प्रतिबंध 1947 में हटा। सांस्कृतिक रूप से यह कवियों को प्रेरित करता रहा तथा तमिल, तेलुगु आदि भाषाओं में अनुवादित हुआ। फिल्म *आनंदमठ* (1952) में हेमंत मुखर्जी का संगीत, लता मंगेशकर और के.एस. चिन्ना के संस्करण प्रसिद्ध हैं। 20वीं सदी में 100 से अधिक रिकॉर्डिंग हुए। 2002 बीबीसी पोल में *आनंदमठ* संस्करण दूसरे स्थान पर रहा। सरला बिड़ला विश्वविद्यालय के छात्रों के लिए यह गीत राष्ट्रप्रेम की कक्षा से बाहर निकलकर जीवन का हिस्सा बन जाता है—एक ऐसा गान जो हमें याद दिलाता है कि मातृभूमि की सेवा ही सच्ची स्वतंत्रता है।
