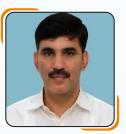

Admission Overview:

Sarala Birla University, Ranchi incepted admissions from the Admission Session 2018-19. SBU started it's operation with 15 courses in the field of Engineering, Management & Humanities. Total number of students enrolled in the inception year were 88. The admission session 2019-20 shows an increase in the number of admissions, with an introduction of 8 new courses the number of admission grew to 541 followed by 954 enrollments in the Admission Session 2020-21 spread across 29 different courses.

Mode Of Admission:

Sarala Birla University, Ranchi offers two modes of admission for the convenience of the students and parents.

- a) Online Admission: Students from remote locations who are unable to visit campus physically have the privilege to complete entire admission process in online mode. Students are provided with admission link https://admission.sbu.ac.in by dedicated counsellors (Link is also available on our website) who facilitate students throughout the admission journey and beyond.
- b) Offline Admission: Considering that a number of people are still untouched by digital literacy SBU also accepts admissions in offline mode. Students/Parents can visit the campus, Consult with any one of our counselors and complete the entire process in offline mode.

Scholarship Scheme:

Sarala Birla University in line with it's commitment of Higher Education for Meritorious & Needy have launched a number of Scholarship Schemes. Merit Scholarship, Defense Scholarship, Scholarship To Physically Handicapped, Jharkhand E-Kalyan Scholarship, Bihar E-Kalyan Scholarship are a few to name. Almost 50% of total intake pursuing education in the University are under one or the other scholarship scheme. The Scholarship awarded ranges from 10% on tuition fee to 100% on tuition fee.

Minimum Eligibility:

Sarala Birla University strictly follows the Minimum Eligibility Criteria set by UGC/AICTE for admission in different courses (Enclosed herewith is the minimum eligibility criteria). Reserved categories (ST/SC) are relaxed to a maximum of 5% in the percentage secured in qualifying examination. University conducts Ph.D. Entrance Exam twice every year to enroll students in Ph.D. Programs.

Examination Overview

All the students are evaluated on the basis of examination, class tests, home assignments, term papers and class performance.

As per the Examination Pattern, Internal Assessment carry 30 marks and End Semester Examination carry 70 marks. Internal Assessment consists of Attendance 5 marks, Faculty Assessment 5 marks and Mid Semester exam 20 marks. The coverage of the mid semester examination is 50% of the syllabus and conducted approx. 50-60 days since the commencement of session.

The Grade-Point system is used in evaluating a student's performance in each term and over the duration of Programme, a student must obtain a minimum required Cumulative Grade Point Average (C.G.P.A.).

To be eligible to enroll in the next semester, a student must have appeared in the end semester examination of at least 1 course in the present semester. Further, to become eligible for enrolment in II, III or IV year it is must to earn minimum 50% credit in I, II or III year cumulatively.

35% is the minimum passing criteria for theory courses of UG and Diploma programmes, whereas for theory courses of PG programmes, it is 40%. For Lab and Project courses, it is 50% for all.

Degrees to be Awarded (for Academic Year 2018-21)

Those who successfully complete the Programme are yet to be awarded with the Degree. Below is chart of Distinction and Class Award.

Academic Collaboration

The Performance Evaluation course started on 6th October, 2021 and three students of the SBU, Akash Gautam, Raman Kumar Choudhary and Anjali Agrawal, from final year Computer Science & Engineering were enrolled for the course. It was a course of 26 hours altogether. Prof. S. B. Dandin, was involved in the selection process of the course. The trainer for the course was Nikos Parlavantzas, who is a professor from INSA, Rennes, France. The topics which were focused during the course include Experiment designing, Data presentation, Performance patterns, Monitoring tools, Operational analysis, Queuing theory, Amdahl's Law, Gustafson-Barsis' Law and the Simulation. As a

project, the students had to compare and analyze the performance of two different databases. In the project, a group of three students were made, in which two students were from INSA and one from SBU. Anjali compared performance of Cassandra and ScyllaDB, while Akash compared and evaluated OpenFaas vs OpenWhisk and Raman worked with Nginx and Caddy. The exam of the course was held on 08th December, 2021 in which students were tested on practical approach. The students gained good knowledge from the course and hence the course had a good outcome.

Facilities at SBU, Ranchi, have grown over the past four years. With the primary objective of facilitation to all associated with the University related to scholarships, conveyance, medical, Pandemic, etc., a comprehensive view has been provided below in consultation with the HR and Accounts Dept.

- 1. As per its policies, during the Pandemic period in 2020-21, all the University staff have received full salary as scheduled, without any deduction.
- 2. The University has provided 100% scholarship to the 2020 batch & 50% scholarship to the 2021 batch to those students who have lost their father due to Covid.

100 % scholarship in the year 2020-21 -- 10 students

50 % scholarship in the year 2021-22 -- 1 student.

 The University offers 15% special scholarship to the wards of policemen, army personnel, freedom fighters, differently abled and migrant students from Jammu & Kashmir.

15% Scholarship was offered to -- 33 students in 2020-21.

15% Scholarship was offered to -- 1 student in 2021.

4. University offers other merit scholarships varying from 10% to 100% and also some special scholarships to meritorious students.

New Facilities

10% scholarship to---309 students.15% scholarship to---33 students.20% scholarship to---217 students.50% scholarship to50 students and100% scholarship to---49 students.

- 5. Free conveyance facility is extended to all teaching and non-teaching staff in various routes on all working days and also on special activity days. Students also avail this facility on the payment of stipulated bus fees.

Introduction

DPR is an essential aspect of the teaching and learning process. Every faculty member has expected to take an active role in their academic lives, and they must keep informed of all class events and activities. On the other hand, it is essential to acquire feedback on their daily progress. It helps lead them to steer towards more successful learning in the future.

Motivation and Objective

- a) Track daily academic goals.
- b) Determine which subject needs more of their attention.
- c) Assessment of class strength, the status of academic responsibilities, and activities.
- d) Receive valuable tips for how to approach a subject to achieve better results.
- e) Receive useful recommendations for further work to ensure a successful education.

Structure of DPR

The DPR has been prepared as a spreadsheet for each individual (teaching/non-teaching faculty). In the beginning, the spreadsheet was personally sent to teaching/non-teaching members for regular class assessment.

A. DPR for Teaching

The Teaching Faculty Spreadsheet consists of several attributes such as:

- a) Date: It holds information about which day the class has been held.
- b) Subject/Branch: The respective subject name has been given in this field.
- c) Timing of Class Start & End: It contains each class timing.
- d) Topic Covered: Faculty updates the information about the topic covered on the same date.
- e) Total Student Strength: It presents the overall strength of that class.
- f) Number of Students/Absent: It shows the number of students present in the same class
- g) Student Strength in percentage: It calculates the class strength in the ratio.
- h) Lecture not Held: If for any reason classes were not held, the respective faculty has to state the reason.

DAILY PROGRESS REPORT

- i) Other Activity: If the class is not held due to some college/personal reasons, the faculty updates this field based on that information.
- j) Remarks of (Dean Academic): DPR is used for daily class information updating and is also used for recommendation. This field contains the statements from higher authorities based on the class progression.
- k) Remarks: Faculty adds some comments based on respective classes. It helps them to provide a clear vision for the next class.

B. DPR for Non-Teaching Member

The DPR is not restricted to faculty members but is also carried forward to Non-Teaching Members. There is a slight change in the DPR for non-teaching. The spreadsheet is consist of:

- a) Date: It holds the information about which day, what activity is held.
- b) Activity: Every action of the lab is recorded in this field.
- c) Remarks of (Dean Academic): This field contains higher authorities' comments based on the lab progression.
- d) Remarks: Members mark the lab requirements which is supposed to be generated during the class.

Life @ SBU:

At Sarala Birla University, we believe that the quality of campus upkeep reflects the quality of education. In keeping with its strong pro-green tradition, no effort is spared in ensuring that the sprawling 55 acres campus is kept clean, green and becoming of our lofty educational standards. Central Library: The library of the University has
